Forest Lanes Fourth In Green

In 1961 Mick, George and Steve Stepanic purchased a piece of property that was a corn field from Dan Bailey and Anna Furey. They then built a bowling center consisting of 12 lanes and named it Forest Lanes. They added 4 lanes in 1980 making Forest Lanes the largest center in the McCook Association.

Mick was the last brother to operate the center. A few other people obtained Forest Lanes on land contract and ran it for a short time. Ed Masters ran it for some time. Next, Dave and Theresa Firth and Mark and Veronica Beresford were partners for about a year. It was finally sold to Bertha, Bruce and Jamie Wright on January 6th, 1992. The Wrights are still operating the bowling center.


Forest Lanes has been flooded about 5 times. The worst being in 2000. It took a lot of work to get the center back up and running. They are still doing things to improve it. They were well prepared for the last flood that came though. They kept it from flooding with the use of sump pumps, sealing all the doors and some hard work. Along

with all the repairs, they added automatic scorers in 2002. The Wrights also added a large addition known as the beer garden. It has a Tiki Room with a beach scene mural painted on the wall. They hold corn-hole league and tournaments in the summer.

Helping Bruce and Bertha run the business are their grandsons, Chip and Taylor, Bertha's brother Bill, Gary Harold, Dale "Stick" Man, Vaugh Erb, and Vera Fox. Jamie takes care of the lounge and the many banquets that are held at the lanes.

Bowling at Forest has been and probably always will be a generational past time. In the beginning, Mick and Edith Stepanic had four generations bowling: Mick and Edith, great grandparents, Rena Taylor, grandmother, Holly Taylor Abel, mother, and her son, Brandon Abel.

The Wrights' have several family members currently bowling: three sons, Bruce II, Jamie, and Brian "Munch", three grandsons, Chip, Taylor and Conner. Sisters June and Bonnie, a brother Bill, nieces Missy, Stephanie and Barb, nephews Troy, Alex and Trent also Charlie and his wife Holly.



Women Hall of Fame members from Forest are Dora Mae Clapsaddle 1981 General Welfare, Edith Stepanic 1983 General Welfare, Harriet Bowman 1987 General Welfare, Pauline McGoogan 2004 General Welfare, Peggy Knestrick 2007 General Welfare, Bonnie Roudebush 2008 General Welfare and Mary Houchins 2008 Bowling Ability. Peggy and Bonnie are the only mother and daughter combination in the McCook HOF.

Men Hall of Fame members are Mick Stepanic, Ray Scott, Howard Batcl, George Stapanic and Joe Patlyski. Mick and George are brothers.

Holly Taylor Abel held the highest average in the McCook Association for a number of years. Her highest being a 198. She was the second McCook bowler to roll a 700 series with a 719. Her high game was a 280. More recently, Mary Houchins also held the highest McCook average with a 200 in the 2001-02 season. Her high game was a 290 and high series was a 737.

In 1981, Francis Abel, Holly's husband, rolled the first 300 game at Forest Lanes. Fred Miller rolled a 300 game on October 30, 2001. His first game of the series was a 300 and his second game was a dutch 200.

Stella Hillyer, Edith Stepanic's sister, was the first McCook bowler to win an Ohio State bowling medal. In 1981-1982 she had the second highest game in her division with a 278. Dora Mae Clapsaddle was another good bowler from Forest. She also won a State bowling medal and some BPAA tournaments.

Peggy Knestrick, is one of the two 81 year "young" ladies that bowl at Forest. She has bowled in a lot of State and National tournaments. Also, Rose Bowman has returned to the lanes this year after taking a few years off from bowling.

The Leagues at Forest Lanes are: Mondays, Mens' National; Wednesdays, Ladies Afternoon Delight; Wednesdays, Men; Thursdays, Buckeye's Women League and Saturdays, the Youth League.

The Youth program was started in the 70's by Judy Altenhot and Edith Stepanic. They coached the league for a number of years. Vera Fox is now the coach for the youth. A team consisting of Chip Wright, Jess Fritzpatrick, Jonanthon Owsley and 7 year old Connor Wright won the regional's and advanced to the State and won that also!

Chip Wright bowled on the Minerva High School League four years. His average was a 208. For try outs he rolled a 770 series. Taylor Wright is now on the high School team, averaging 205. He rolled a 730 series for try outs!

The Youth League was named for Ray Scott who passed away. He always sponsored a team and supported them in anyway he could. Bruce's friend "Stick" had a saying. When anyone complained about conditions he would ask, "Did you roll one pretty strike? If so keep doing the same thing!".

Bruce and Bertha hope that their grandchildren continue with the business!


